FYi: Pricing guidance from Dona Baliotis is as follows:

Everyday things: small pots \$4, medium pots \$5-6, larger \$6+

Natives and butterfly \$5, bigger \$6-8

Unusual, rare or specialty small \$4-6 medium \$6-8, large-10-12

Spiky things especially agaves usually not more than \$4-5 unless something really different

Succulents start at \$5 and go up depending on size and rarity

Anything looking nice and in bloom - add \$1-2 to above price.

STROLLING FLOWER SHOW THIS FRIDAY

What is a strolling flower show? It's floral designs created by Garden Clubbers placed in shop or restaurant windows in a designated commercial area. Viewers can

stroll around the area to admire the floral creations.

You can visit the Strolling Flower Show in downtown Fort Myers on Feb. 4, the same night as the River District Alliance monthly Art Walk, It's also the weekend of the big Fort Myers Art Show, so there will be lots of exposure over the weekend for the clubs and societies who are participating including several designers from our club.

The event will officially be open from 6pm to 8pm; voting for People's Choice will open at 6pm. The winner will be announced at 8:30 pm at 1st and Hendry Streets on the 4th Feb.

The RDA have secured the storefront windows for the designs, and Fort Myers-Lee County Garden Council is providing signage for the designs/displays. Designs will stay in the window throughout the weekend. This first year will NOT be an FFGC judged event.

So, why not make a date for dinner with friends on Feb 4 in Downtown Fort Myers, "stroll the show!" and vote for your favorite design in the People's Choice poll. Or go look at the displays and also enjoy the big Art Show on Saturday.
