CHORES AND PLANTING GUIDE FOR NOVEMBER – ZONE 10

- Find some time to create a display of fall colors with cool-season plants. Some examples include impatiens, strawflower, cape daisy, and pansy.
- Many bulbs like to get their start in cool weather. Bulbs to plant this month include amaryllis, crinum, and the many varieties of elephant's ear.
 - Continue planting herbs from seeds or plants. A wide variety of herbs like cooler, dryer weather, including cilantro, dill, fennel, parsley, sage, and thyme.
- Lots of choices exist for November including beans, broccoli, kale, snow/English peas, and strawberries.
- Divide and replant overgrown perennials and bulbs now so that they establish before the coolest weather arrives.
- Turn off systems and water only if needed. Plants need less supplemental watering in cooler weather.
- Watch for hornworms on tomatoes and poinsettias planted in the landscape. This pest can quickly defoliate a plant. Handpick or treat only the infested area.


DISTRICT IX MEETING – OCTOBER 17TH


Burroughs Home and Gardens Tour – October 12th




GARDEN CLUB UPCOMING TRIPS

Bee Balm (Monarda) are lovely flowers that resemble a daisy with an unruly hair day. If you plant them, you'll make a lot of pollinators happy. However, the local mosquito population won't be thrilled. Bee balm has a particularly strong scent reminiscent of the bergamot orange (hence bee balm's nickname of bergamot), which mosquitoes don't like. Consider planting bee balm around areas where you enjoy

spending time outdoors to help keep those annoying skeeters away. Bee balm is a popular medicinal plant used to alleviate nausea, menstrual cramps and even help you sleep.
