


History of the Burrowing Owls of Cape Coral





Ogygoptynx, the oldest owl on record, lived in what is now Colorado about 61 million years ago, just a few million years after the nonavian dinosaurs went extinct about 65 million years ago.

The skeleton of **Primoptynx poliotauros** is the oldest fossil of an owl preserved in such a state of completeness. The discovery provides unique insights into the lifestyle of the earliest owls. Unlike modern owls, the large extinct owl presumably did not kill its prey with its beak but with its talons, similar to goshawks and eagles.




The rocky chunk holding the fragile fossilized bones of the ancient owl, next to a quarter for size comparison. (Image credit: John Alexander)

The largest owl on record is Cuba's extinct giant owl (*Ornimegalonyx*), modeled here at the American Museum of Natural History's "Cuba!" exhibition.


Experts aren't sure whether the 3.6-foot-tall (1.1 meters) owl could fly, but its powerful, long legs indicate that it was a gold-medal runner. If it could fly or glide, it would have been one of the largest flighted birds the world has ever known.

Researchers have found (Ornimegalonyx) remains in Cuban caves, usually surrounded by the remnants of the bird's prey, including sloths and now-extinct rodents known as hutias.

 The burrowing owl was formally described by Spanish naturalist Juan Ignacio Molina in 1782 from a specimen collected in Chile.

Discovery of a Barrowing Owl in Florida.

One of the most important results of the ornithological cal researches of Mr. N. B. Moore, of Manaton, Florida, a very diligent and trustworthy observer and an esternreconnected of the continuous institution, is the discovery in Piorida, of a burrowing owl. In this not only is an entirely new element added to the bird-fauna of the Eastern Region of North America, but the geographical range of the genus is extended to a country for distant from any of which it has been considered specially characteristic; while besides the bird under consideration proves to be new to science.

The genus Speciate, of which the burrewing owls of America are the sole representatives, embraces but a single species as far so known, which extends from Chill, Buscon Ayres and Paraguny northward across the pampas and Banos of South America and over the plateaux of Mexico to the dry ploins of the western contestring of North America. 

Official City Bird Out of 171-222 species of owls worldwide, the Burrowing Owl is the only one that lives underground in burrows.




Burrowing Owl Status



About the Burrowing Owls












Eye Color Related to Hunting
