
We would like to share some information about Belinda Kullson that she has provided.

Bus trip to Fruit & Spice Park


The Garden Club took off on January 17th for the East Coast to visit the Fruit & Spice Park that is nestled in the heart of the historic Redland community. It was a very long bus ride, but once we hopped on the tram, we couldn't wait to get started with our tour. The park is the only tropical botanical garden of its kind in the United States. It has more than 500 varieties of exotic fruits, herbs, spices, and nuts from around the world – 180 varieties of mangos; 70 varieties of bamboo; 40 varieties of bananas; 15 varieties of jackfruit trees and numerous other exotic edibles are grown and maintained here at the park. We took the taste tour, and we were all able to indulge our taste buds on fruits we may never experience again.

5-1-7	CHORES AND PLANTING GUIDE FOR FEBRUARY – ZONE 10
	 Plants that perform better in the cooler months include petunia, pansy, verbena dianthus, strawflower, and lobelia. Protect from frosts and freezing temperature Good performers for annual bedding plants in the Deep South's mild winter include impatiens, verbena, dianthus, strawflower, and lobelia. Many bulbs can be planted now. Divide large, crowded clumps. Provide adequat water for establishment. Some examples include Amazon lily, crinum, and agapanthus. Consider replacing areas of grass with drought-tolerant, low-maintenance
1012 - 10 (11)	groundcovers.
	 Winter vegetable gardening is in full swing. Last month to plant cantaloupes, cucumbers, eggplant, lettuce, peppers, spinach, and tomatoes for a late spring harvest. Protect crops in the unlikely event of a frost or freeze. Prune roses this month to remove damaged canes and improve the overall form After pruning, fertilize and apply a fresh layer of mulch. Blooming will begin 8–9 weeks after pruning.
•	Fertilize shrubs and palms by spreading fertilizer evenly over the soil surface an watering it in. Follow with a fresh layer of mulch to conserve moisture and reduce weeds. Delay pruning any cold-damaged branches until new growth starts. Disease-susceptible varieties of avocado and mango may require applications o
0.5	copper fungicide.
	 Fertilize citrus trees now if not done in January. Frequency and amount of fertilization depend on the age of the tree. (Source: Sow True Seed)
